Thousands of Science Teachers Converge on Philadelphia for Annual Conference

Science teachers from across the nation will be in Philadelphia later this week, sharing strategies.



About 15,000 members of the **National Science Teachers**

Association will meet this coming Thursday through Sunday at the Pennsylvania Convention Center and other center city locations.

Among the presentations they'll hear are several by fellows of the Moorestown, NJ-based Knowles Science Teaching Foundation.

Foundation executive director Angelo Collins (above, pointing out the locations of KSTF fellows across the nation) says teacher Casey O'Hara of California will talk about the construction of a device to detect subatomic particles called neutrinos:

"Casey actually went down to the South Pole, where he participated in research on a neutrino detector and wrote curriculum materials while he was down there."

Among the other speakers at the meeting is "science guy" Bill Nye.
